Please accept this letter as my formal response to Ms. complaint of unprofessional conduct dated 13 January 2021. I have appended a number of enclosures,


Upon review of the GATB manual, which I located in the Mandel and Associates test library and is the same manual used by Dr. Mandel in my training when I joined the firm, I can confirm that the GATB was normed on a sample of 234 elementary and secondary school teachers the average G was 118 with a standard deviation of 13. A cross validation sample of 263 elementary and secondary school teachers indicated the average G to be 111 with a standard deviation of 13. Ms.

score on the G scale of the GATB was 33, over 2 standard deviations below the normative sample average.
